



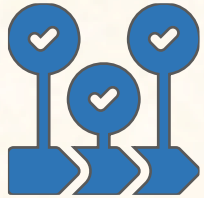

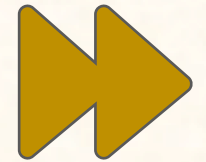

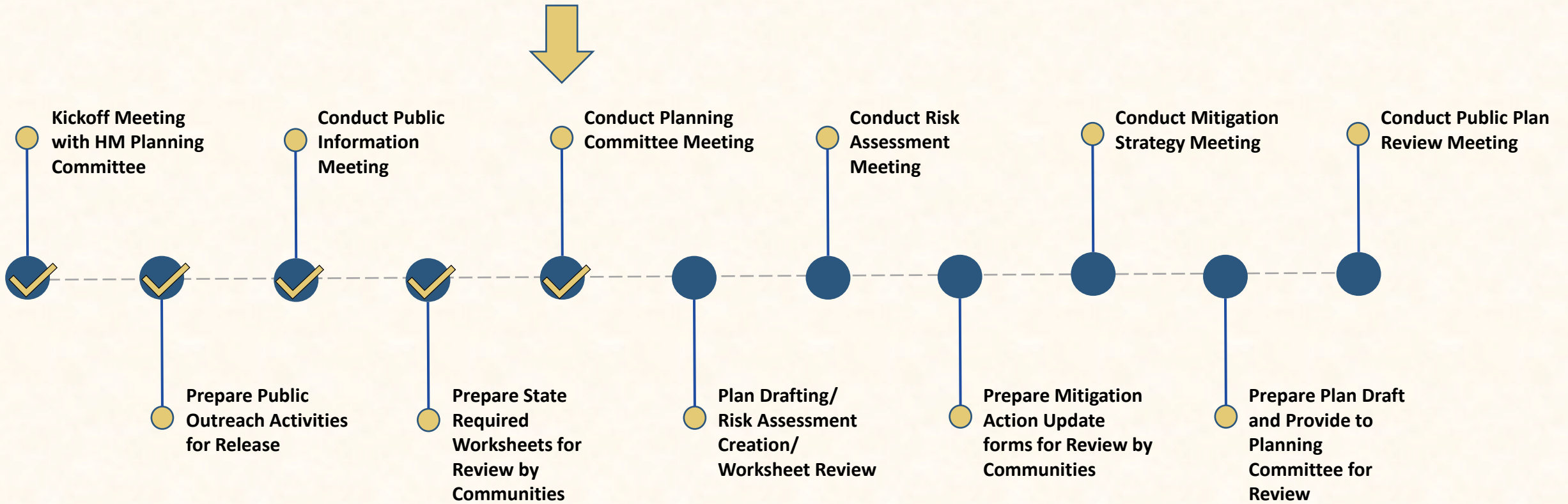
Hazard Mitigation Planning is a process that identifies natural hazard risks and develops strategies to reduce these risks

# HMP Update Requirements



**Must be updated and receive FEMA approval every five years**

- Reassess risks, vulnerabilities & mitigation strategy
- Must reflect changes in conditions & development



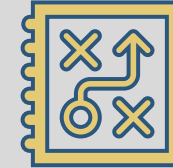
**Must include a robust planning committee/ stakeholder group**

- Incorporated jurisdictions
- Local/parish agencies
- Local business/ industry
- Underserved populations



**Must identify and evaluate the risks from natural hazards**

- Types/sources of hazards
- Location/extent
- Impacts on community
- Previous occurrences
- Potential for future events



**Must outline strategy for reducing impacts for identified risks**

- Set clear goals/ objectives
- Identify actions or projects
- Establish timelines, responsible parties & funding sources



**Must be formally adopted by all participating jurisdictions**

- All HM plans in LA are multi-jurisdictional
- Administered at parish level
- Incorporated communities within parish must also adopt

Completing all state-required worksheets

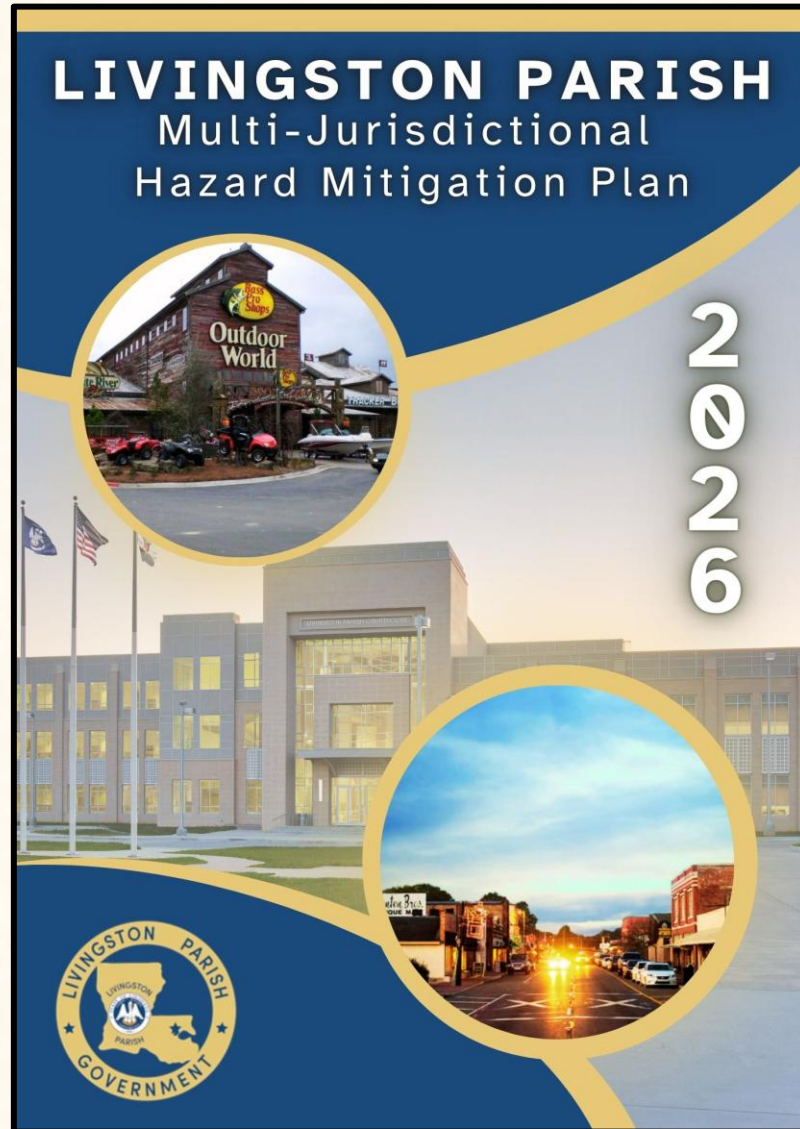

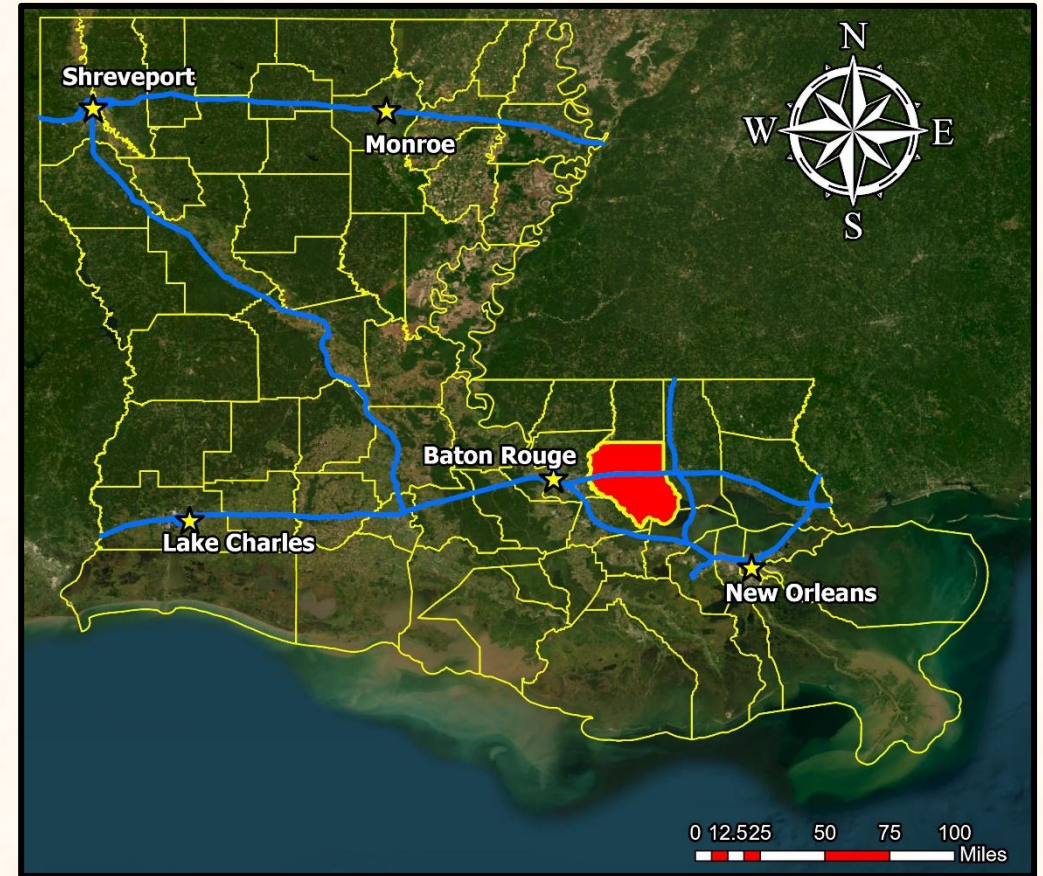

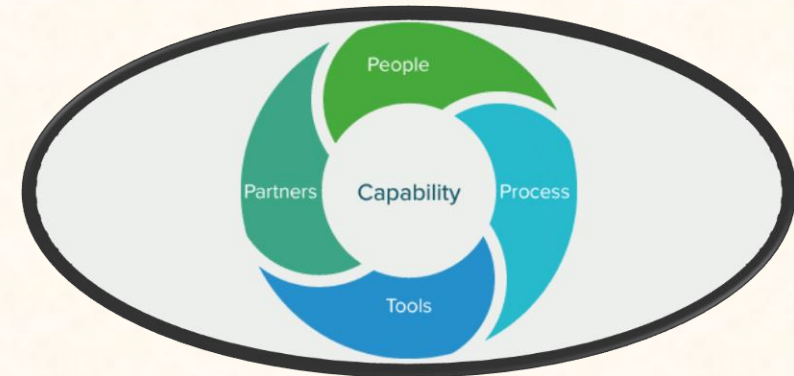

Regularly review progress and adjust strategies to reflect new risks and opportunities.



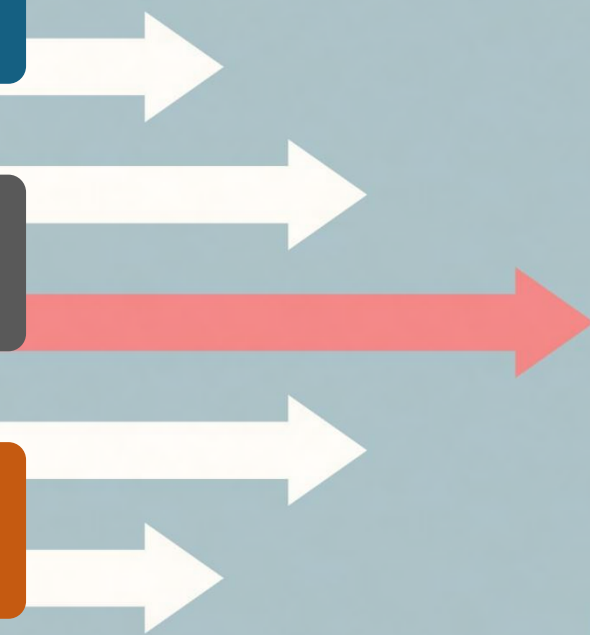
# Livingston Parish Hazard Mitigation Goals





# Survey Trends So Far...

- As of October 27, 2025:
  - **50** responses collected
  - **Hurricanes, Flooding, and Tornadoes** are the hazards of greatest concern to respondents.
  - **52%** of respondents place trust in their local government for hazard information than in ten other external sources.
    - **57%** say social media is most effective way to get information on making their home safer from disasters.
  - **33%** of respondents are unaware if their home is in a flood zone.
